
"How's this for meta?" Illustrator Liana Finck views the viewers at last Thursday night's gallery openings in Chelsea.





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

Untitled (Tape 3), 2008 Acrylic paint on wall


In the fall of 2008 I purchased my first iPhone. (I am not an early adopter).
